

BALI SANDAT

Where Bali remains unspoilt

Far away from mass tourism, in the North-East of the island of Bali, lies the village of *Bondalem*.

Bali Sandat (Ylang-Ylang) is situated at the edge of the village, directly on the Pacific Ocean).



Bali Sandat, surrounded by the vegetation, the sounds and smells of the tropics, entices to just being, relaxing, dreaming...



The sea, with its corals and multicoloured fishes, invites to swimming and snorkeling.

THE HOUSE

The two-storey bungalow *Bali Sandat* is built in the local style with natural materials, and furnished with bamboo and rattan. Each of the four rooms has its private, half-open bath (WC/shower), with a view of the palm trees and, at night, the starlit sky.



The large terraces with sea view invite you to dream away your time.



The house is surrounded by a large, varied garden with coconut, mango, papaya, banana and rambutan trees.

There is also a small temple with the rich-flowering, fragrant Frangi-pani tree. Every year in the month of March, a temple ceremony takes place there.

The kitchen house is the kingdom of Made Sri, who spoils the guests with her local dishes, freshly prepared every day with vegetables and fruits from the village market. Together with her husband Nyoman, Made Sri cares for the well-being of the guests.



THE VILLAGE AND ITS ENVIRONMENT

It is worth-while to explore the closer environment on foot, be it the beach of black Lava sand and pebbles, the village or the hilly hinterland. You will surely enjoy the contact with the open Balinese people and the local culture.

In Bondalem itself you can, for instance:

- » take a trip out to the sea with a neighbour on his fishing boat to watch the sunrise
- » experience the early morning hustle and bustle on the village market
- » observe the manufacturing of the traditional multi-coloured *ikat* fabrics in Mr. Wayan's weaving workshop.



Would you like to enjoy a massage?

For an original Balinese massage, ask Made Sri.

You can also get an Ayurvedic massage in the nearby Bali Mandala Resort.

SUGGESTIONS FOR ONE-DAY OR HALF-DAY EXCURSIONS



- » Walk from the village of Les (15 minutes drive), through a beautiful tropical landscape, to an impressive waterfall.
 - » Visit to the unique Buddhist temple *Brahma Vihara Arama*, and bath in the holy waters of *Banjar* (approx. 1.5 hours drive).
 - » Excursion to Singaraja (40 minutes)/Lovina (1 hr), combined with a bath in *Air Saneh* (fresh water spa).
- » Excursion to the artists' village of Ubud (approx. 2 hours drive): walks through paddy fields, shopping, restaurants, museums...

Some practical information

The village is well connected by public mini buses (*bemos*), which run regularly.

For more distant trips, you can rent a car. (Nyoman)

Post, telephone and Internet access are available in the village of Bondalem.

The nearest place to change foreign currency is the provincial capital Singaraja (30 km).

You can find Internet Cafés and money changers in the tourist area of Lovina.

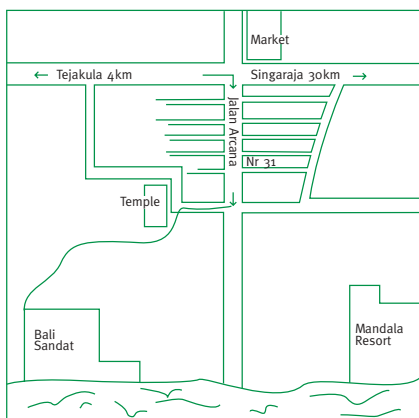
Attention: you will need plastic shoes to enter the sea, as there are sharp corals.

HOW TO GET THERE

It takes approximately 3 hours by car from the airport in Denpasar in the south of the island. You drive through Sanur, Madenan, Batubulan, Payangan, Batur in the village of Lateng, where you turn right and arrive on the main coastal road between Tejakula and Bondalem.



Turn left to enter the *village of Bondalem*, then turn right direction „Pantai“ (beach). You arrive on the Jalan (road) Arcana, where you contact Nyoman Muarcaya at house No 31 (see map).



Airport pick-up can be arranged on request.
